An application for funding has been put in to Key Fund to enable an evaluation of how the forum can move forward. Francis Feeley is dealing with this application.

It was announced that as of 15th May, Suzy Cornwell Ball would take on the role of UnLtd Development Manager for the area; Saghir Ahmed will revert to his role as Business Champion.

Pete Handy gave feedback from the 'Keeping In Touch' meeting with the mainstream support various agencies that operate in the area. This is a good step in building relationships with them.

There was a good discussion of the idea that Wicker and Spital Hill could be designated Sheffield's 'spice mile' to maximize the potential of the area.

JUNE MEETING

Management Committee Meeting: 6th June

Discussion with Mike Atkin of Simpson (York) Ltd about the use of local contractors on the Vestry Hall refurbishment. Although specialist work could not be given to local companies, there will




Laycock Jewellers


The skills, patience and warmth of Keith and the rest of the team will be sorely missed in Burngreave but we all wish him the very best in his retirement – he deserves it.

"I would love to be able to take on two local people from Burngreave because I want staff with local knowledge and it's important to me to see the area grow," says Leroy.
